Boeing News: History and 2020 Outlook

On October 1st, the nation celebrated the birth of William E. Boeing, the founder and creator of The Boeing Company dating back to 1916, as well as the first routes of United Airlines.

Today, Boeing is one of, if not the most, notorious airlines companies in the world. In mid October this year, Boeing released their "2020 Pilot and Technician Outlook," which touched base on the company's projections for career outlooks of the aviation industry. According to Boeing, approximately 763,000 new civil aviation pilots will be in demand globally over the next 20 years. In addition to this, the forecast predicted a need for 739,000 maintenance technicians needed in the next 20 years, as well as 903,000 cabin crew members. These numbers have only slightly decreased from Boeing's 2019 projections.
