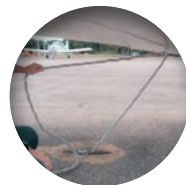

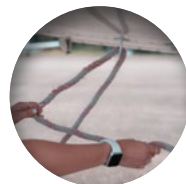
Airplane Tie Down

Properly tying down the aircraft after flight is essential in order to reduce movement in the event of high winds.

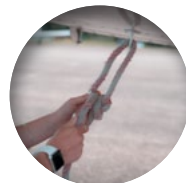
TYING TWO HALF-HITCHES



1 Line the airplane up over the yellow center line.



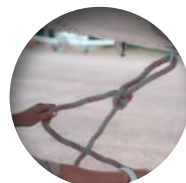
2 Run rope through the tiedown eyelet from the back of the airplane to the front.



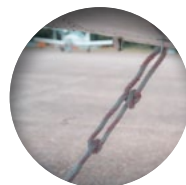
3 Create a number four with the rope and guide the end through the opening, six to 12 inches from the airplane's tiedown eyelet.



4 Repeat to form a second half-hitch, pulling the line around and over the first, then locking it under the first with a sharp tug.



5 Now form a second set of half-hitches, six to 12 inches below the first set, by repeating steps 3 and 4.



6 The two sets of half-hitches are complete!
