

1. Flaps increase lift and drag and this drag increase will decrease the best L/D ratio. The glide angle will then be steeper and glide range shorter. 2. It is a go-around done without fill power and a decreased angle-of-attack. It is used in commercial aircraft to diminish Somatogravic Illusions. They are particularly dangerous in instrument conditions. 3. Generally false. This is a common misconception. The white arc is designed for full flap deployment at gross weight (actually at the bottom of the white arc). Many aircraft allow partial flap deployment above the white arc, Cessna 172 and 182 for example. Always check your POH for proper flap deployment speeds. 4. Airplane is used in American English and Aeroplane in British English. Either are correct. 5. Those windows allow a flight attendant to check the airplane's slats or flaps if the captain requests, they will know exactly where to go for the best view. 6. Maybe, If the plane is less than gross weight the stall speed will be lower than at gross weight, so a lower speed than at the bottom of the white arc. Ever notice when doing a power off stall the plane actually stalls at a speed lower than the bottom of the white arc. When training you are less than gross weight.
